



Sunday May 13th Partner's arrival to Võru (Estonia)

- **From Riga airport by car.** You have option to take the road “around Riga” or “through town”. At daytime the town is full of traffic, so I would recommend to drive around the town. Once through the town, take road A2/E77 (leading to Pskov, Russia; in Latvian the signs show PLESKAVA). You will drive through Latvian town Sigulda, continue on the road until you see signs of town “APE”. Turn left to road 68/67 and you will be shortly in Estonia. Drive through



Vastse-Roosa until Mõniste, then follow the signs to Võru. Once you reach the town, Hotel Kubija will be on the right hand (look out for the signs)!





- **From Tallinn airport by car.** Just follow road 2/E263 and the signs Tartu and Luhamaa. Don't drive into Tartu, but go around from the right hand side, following the signs Luhamaa and Võru. When arriving to Võru, drive straight ahead through the town, cross the railway and turn right. Soon you will see signs for Hotel Kubija (you will have to turn left).
- **From Tallinn by bus.** You can find bus schedules on website <https://www.tpilet.ee/en> entering the names of bus stations: Tallinn Coach Station - Võru Coach Station . To see more options, select "Transfer: connecting trips" and it will show all the connections that at first take you to Tartu and then from Tartu to Võru. There are also many Tallinn-Võru buses, but they all make a stop in Tartu anyway 😊
To get from Tallinn airport to the bus station, take a taxi, it is just a 5-6 minutes ride.

MINUTE OF THE 3th TRANSNATIONAL MEETING PROJECT LIVING HERITAGE

Date: 14, 15 May 2018-05-15

Place: Võru (Estonia)

The meeting was held on 14 and 15 May 2018 in the city of Võru, at the south of Estonia, at the place provided by the partner Siksali.

The meeting began on May 14 at 9:20 a.m. with the welcome by Siksali (Kaidi- Mari), being present:

Monday, 14 May 2018

Following the welcome to Siksali

The meeting begins with the reading of the letter sent by the Deputy of Culture of the Diputación de Palencia, as coordinator of the project, basically transmitting their greetings and regrets for the impossibility of attending the third transnational meeting of the Living Heritage project, and summoning them to the next project activities to be held in Spain in which they are working.

Thanks are given and the Estonian partner, SIKSALI, is congratulated for the magnificent organization of this 3rd Transnational Meeting in Võru (Estonia).

Subsequently, the possibility of proposing to the coordinator (Diputación de Palencia) the change of dates of the last transnational meeting due to the incompatibility of the agenda of all the partners to attend Palencia on the dates initially scheduled for the month of September 2018 is debated.

Following is the reading and verification of the minutes of the II Transnational Meeting held in Bragança (22, 23 June 2017). Once reviewed, it is signed by all the members present (Missing by signing CoraNE and Diputación de Palencia)

Subsequently, the Power Point presentation begins with a review of the degree of compliance with the objectives and the general status of the project to date, making a synthesis of the progress, collaborations and results obtained in the different participating countries.

The dissemination Plan that is being carried out is analyzed and the leaflets printed by the Diputación de Palencia are delivered to the partners who did not have it in paper format yet (only in on-line format). A count is made of the stakeholders achieved by each of the partners and other types of collaborations.

Review of the Participatory Workshops: Study, review and internal evaluation of the workshops held in the different countries (Dates, places, contents, participants, activities carried out and main conclusions obtained: in relation to Peer Learning Method and with the approaches and contents of the rest of the intellectual products of the LIVING HERITAGE project).

11:00 a.m. Coffee Break.

11:30 a.m. We started the meeting again.

Review of the IO1 (Peer Learning Method) again. Summary and internal evaluation by all present partners of what has been done so far, especially the practical part, focusing on the example developed on Archaeological Heritage centered on the Roman village of Olmeda (Spain).

There is a debate on the possible distribution of the rest of the practical examples that will be included to complete the IO1, with the final distribution agreed upon as follows:

1. Popular architecture: *Agroinstitut nitra* (Slovakia)
2. Immaterial heritage: *Siksali* (Estonia). It is agreed in the meeting that a good example for this section can be the knowledge of the culture and ethnic group called Estonian Setos and their traditional singing among other oral traditions (visit made by the participants in the transnational meeting to Obinitza on May 14th in the afternoon).
3. Historical-artistic heritage: *AEGEAS* (Greece)
4. Ethnographic heritage: *CoraNE* (Portugal)

Subsequently, the final contents included in the IO2 "Curriculum for the teaching of European Cultural Heritage" will be reviewed and verified according to the information sent by the different countries, as a result of the Participatory Workshops held. The incorporation of some new modules and the final outline of contents within each of the modules is approved, marking the difference between the Primary and Secondary Curriculum, mainly in terms of the teaching-learning activities suggested and the evaluation standards.

The distribution of documentation of the development of some of the modules of the educational Curriculum is carried out for the realization of an internal evaluation according to the established criteria: structure of the contents, clarity in the presentation, interest and relevance of the information, extension of the information and final suggestions.

Next, IO3 (Methodological Guide) and IO4 (Educational Resources) are discussed. It is agreed that all Spanish partners (Diputación de Palencia, SERVIMA and ADESPER) will generate the methodological guide, with the collaboration in the contribution of information from other partners. In consensus, it is decided that the introduction of this methodological guide is similar to that used in the IO1 (Peer Learning Method).

After discussing the different intellectual products it is agreed that the first two (which are the ones financed) are translated into the language corresponding to each country as initially agreed in the presented project (although not all the documentation, only the final results of IO1 and IO2).

The points of:

1. Multiplier event (E1) to be held in Estonia: How many people will attend, the possible distribution over the 3 days that it should last, and the budget granted for this.
2. Training course (C1) to be held in Palencia. We agree: Draft and present to the SEPIE a communiqué in which the possibility of carrying out the C1 together with the IV Transnational Meeting, taking advantage of the trips of the different partners to Spain), waiting for the response of this body to detail the organization of it.

13:40 Lunch

15:30 We started the meeting again

A general review of the financial status of the project is made (global budget, by items and by partners). The main issues are reviewed in relation to the justification of the expenses by each partner. The importance of presenting the quarterly reports is stressed, with the consensus that all the partners will send before June a count of the hours justified up to now in the different categories specified in the project (Administrative, teacher and technician).

18:00 The meeting ends

18:30 Cultural visit scheduled as a complement to the meeting (as explained to a community (Setos) with great interest from the point of view of intangible heritage and therefore within the LIVING HERITAGE project.

Tuesday, 15 May 2018

9:00: Start of the meeting

The debate opens to square agendas of the different partners in September. AEGEAS and Agroinstitut Nitra only have the last two weeks of this month to travel (as of Saturday 15), for having to make other trips and activities.

Subsequently, the subject of the Permanent Evaluation Plan and the analysis of the established indicators are discussed. The valuation evaluations of the third phase of the project are carried out in relation to the general progress of the project, the intellectual products, the dissemination plan and the transnationality.

The pending tasks are reviewed by each partner that are summarized at the end of this Minute and briefly discussed on the sustainability plan of the project (maintenance of the web, presentation of final intellectual products, etc.).

12:00: The meeting with the signature of the Presence list is concluded and SIKSALI distributes the Certificate of Attendance (signed and sealed) to each of the partners that have attended this event.

Therefore, as summary of the tasks that we need to do yet:

1. **All partners** have to enter the website of the "Living Heritage" to check and verify the texts in the corresponding language of each country.
2. **AEGEAS and CoraNE** must send the pending documentation of the Workshops as soon as possible.
3. **All partners** must review the contents included in the school curriculum (IO2) and add the annotations and suggestions they consider relevant or significant for each country (bearing in mind that the Curriculum will try to capture the European Cultural Heritage, based on all the common elements as in cultural diversity, as a true sign of European cultural identity)
4. **ADESPER** should contact the coordinator (Diputación de Palencia) to verify the agenda of the multiplier event E2 and the IV Transnational Meeting to be held in Palencia.
